Competency Requirements for foundation training (BT)

Learning objective BT1. Acute and non-acute medical conditions

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to diagnose acute medical conditions
- be able to identify signs of critical or serious medical conditions and be able to initiate further management
- be able to start treatment of medical conditions, including life threatening conditions and be able to plan further management
- be able to diagnose elective non acute medical conditions
- be able to plan treatment, treat and follow elective non acute medica conditions and other health problems
- be able to take into consideration the patient's other health conditions, including eventual multimorbidity, and life situation in the management of acute and non-acute medical conditions

Learning objective BT2. Psychiatric medical conditions and other psychological illness

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to diagnose acute psychiatric illnesses
- be able to initiate treatment of acute psychiatric illnesses
- be able to diagnose common non-acute psychiatric conditions
- be able to initiate treatment of common non-acute psychiatric conditions
- be able to consider the patient's other health conditions, including possible multimorbidity, and life situation in the management of acute and non-acute psychiatric illnesses
- be able to assess suicidal risk in a patient and be able to initiate further treatment
- be able to identify signs of a state of confusion in a patient and be able to take adequate measures
- be able to identify signs of addiction in a patient and be able to take adequate measures
- be able to assess the need for compulsory psychiatric care in a patient and be able to issue a medical care certificate
- be able to identify mental illness that does not have its basis in psychiatric illness in a patient and be able to take adequate measures

Learning objective BT3. Laws and other healthcare regulations

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- demonstrate knowledge of laws and other healthcare regulations that apply in Swedish healthcare and for its professionals

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- demonstrate knowledge of the organization and administration of Swedish healthcare, both in terms of the health care for which the regions are responsible and that for which the municipalities are responsible for
- demonstrate knowledge of other actors that are important for healthcare, for example the social service, the Social Insurance Agency and the school

Learning objective BT5. Structured medical care documentation

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- demonstrate knowledge of the purpose of structured care documentation
- be able to document in a way that contributes to good and safe care for the patient

Learning objective BT6. Systematic quality improvement

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- demonstrate knowledge of what systematic quality work entails

Learning objective BT7. Scientific approach

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to critically review and evaluate medical information
- be able to apply a scientific approach in daily work

Learning objective BT8. Ethics in daily work

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to identify and manage ethical conflicts in daily work

Learning objective BT9. Treatment

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to treat people as individuals and with respect regardless of, for example, gender, gender identity or expression, ethnicity, religion or other belief, disability, sexual orientation, and age
- be able to treat patients and relatives with empathy and sensitivity
- be able to adapt the treatment based on the individual conditions of patients and relatives and needs, for example based on a child's maturity level or a patient's cognitive ability

Learning objective BT10. Collaborate and lead the work around the patient

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to collaborate with employees within both own professional group and other professional groups

- be able to lead the multi-disciplinary work around an individual patient
- be able to promote patients' and relatives' participation in care and treatment
- be able to collaborate with actors within and outside of healthcare of an individual patient, for example, with another care unit, the municipal health care, social services, The Social Insurance Agency and the school

Learning objective BT11.Present, explain and instruct

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to present and explain medical information in a clear and accessible way, orally and in writing
- be able to give employees and students instructions on discipline-specific techniques and approach

Learning objective BT12. Children and young patients

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to adapt care based on children's and young patients' special conditions and needs
- demonstrate knowledge of children's rights in healthcare
- be able to identify signs of child abuse or risks of child abuse and be able to take adequate measures

Learning objective BT13. Healthcare hygiene and infection prevention in daily work

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to take responsibility for preventing care-related infections and the spread of infection in daily work

Learning objective BT14. Health promoting measures

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to identify the need for health-promoting interventions for a patient and be able to initiate further management

Learning objective BT15. Drug treatment

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to adapt drug treatment according to a patient's age, gender, weight, kidney and liver function as well as other possible factors, for example other medication, co-morbidity, pregnancy and breastfeeding
- be able to assess risks for interactions and side effects during drug treatment
- demonstrate knowledge of principles for rational antibiotic treatment
- demonstrate knowledge of the impact of medicines on the environment

Learning objective BT16. Medical insurance certificate

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to issue medical insurance certificates

Learning objective BT17. Need of palliative care

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to identify the need for palliative care in a patient and be able to take adequate measures

Learning objective BT18. Death certificate and cause of death certificate

Competency Requirements

The doctor must

- be able to issue a death certificate
- be able to issue a cause of death certificate
